Monitored the progress and gave feedback regarding the Older Adult Plan through regular verbal updates at meetings and an annual written update. The Comprehensive Plan for Serving the Older Adult Community was completed in May 2014. Progress summary of the 51 total recommendations: 47 completed/on-going; 3 in progress; 1 not started. Reviewed and monitored CA new Membership structure and advocated for a senior swim discount. Participated in survey about membership structure.(6 A)

Continued to monitor the progress of the Village in Howard. Several SAC members have joined the Village and they share monthly about activities and membership information. Had a presentation and update from the President from the Village in Howard. Supported CA grant of \$25,000. (2G)

Participated in a Pickleball demonstration at Owen Brown Tennis facility that was led by members of the Howard County Pickleball league. (4B)
